ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

ARTICLE I NAME OF CORPORATION

The name of this corporation is Colorado State Council of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc., and is known as The 61st Episcopal District of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc. - located at 4705 Paris Street #300 – Denver, CO 80239.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE OF CORPORATION

This corporation is being established exclusively for religious, charitable, and educational purposes. No part of the net earnings inures to the benefit of any individual, no substantial part of the activities is carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and does not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP/BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Membership in this corporation will be open to those who are a member in good standing of any church within the Colorado State Council of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc.

The Executive Steering Committee of the Colorado State Council will consist of the Diocesan, Suffragan Bishops, District Elders, Council Chairman, Vice Chairman, General Secretary, Assistant General Secretary, General Treasurer, Assistant General Treasurer.

ARTICLE IV REGISTERED AGENT

The registered agent for the Colorado State Council is Suffragan Bishop John J. Sawyer, located at 4705 Paris Street #300 – Denver, CO 80239.

ARTICLE V MEETINGS/STATEMENTS

The Executive Steering Committee will meet one month prior to each council, as well as during each Council session, to discuss corporate business.

Colorado State Council Minutes and Financial Reports will be distributed during Council sessions; to be held annually in February, June, and September.

ARTICLE VI DURATION/DISSOLUTION

Colorado State Council will exist perpetually until dissolution.

Dissolution of the Colorado State Council will occur with the dissolution of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc., or the non-existence of churches within the Colorado State Council.

In the event of the dissolution of the corporation known as the Colorado State Council of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc., all remaining assets will be distributed to some other non-profit organization of like precious faith that is exempt from taxes, under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Tax Code.

ARTICLE VII PERSONAL LIABILITY

No member of the Colorado State Council will be personally liable or responsible for the debts or obligations of the Colorado State Council.

ARTICLE VIII DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The undersigned agree that any disputes will be resolved by the Executive Steering Committee of the Colorado State Council or a designee of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc.

ARTICLE IX REGULATION

This document, and the corporation established herein, is subject to the laws and regulations of the State of Colorado, of the United States of America.
